Classroom Policy

Late Assignments:

• Labs, assignments and projects are due on the date assigned unless the student has made prior arrangements with the teacher to submit the piece of work at a later date. Should a student be absent on the day a lab, assignment or project is due, the student may hand in the piece of work without penalty as long as the absence is confirmed by a parent/guardian. Failure to hand in a lab, assignment or project on the due date will result in a deduction of 5% of the achieved grade per day later to a maximum of 15% of the achieved grade. Once the teacher has marked and returned a lab, assignment or project, a student can no longer submit the piece of work for marks and will be assigned a zero. The teacher ay, if he or she feels it is suitable, give the student an alternate assignment. Failure to submit the alternate assignment will result in a mark of zero.

Missed Tests

It is a student's responsibility to make arrangements ahead of time for any tests/quizzes that are missed. If a
students misses a test/quiz for an unforeseen reason, the students must be prepared to write the first day they
return. NOTE: Students who miss a test or quiz without a valid excuse from the office will receive an automatic
mark of zero.
